- Work experience
- Safe operation of machinery and tractor driving skills
- Maintenance skills e.g. boundaries
- Agricultural crop production
- Root crop production
- Field vegetable production
- Mechanised agricultural crop handling and storage
- Pollution and waste control
- Agricultural spreaders and sprayers
- ATVs and fork-lifts

A young person completing this qualification could apply for a job in roles such as:

- Agricultural Technician
- Contractor (arable)
- Assistant head tractor driver
- Fixed plant manager
- Sprayer operator
