#### **Entry level**

- If unsuccessful, another assignment on different topic needs to be completed.

#### Levels 1 and 2

- Assessed by multiple choice test
- Externally set and marked by City & Guilds.
- Must be pre-booked for specific date/time, but available on-demand – paper or on-screen (latter with instant results.
- Sample tests (in both formats) available from qualifications webpage.

## Writing and Speaking & Listening (all levels)

- Assessed by assignment.
- Externally set by City & Guilds, internally marked by centre.
- Available to administer as soon as candidates registered.
- Choice of assignments available to download from qualifications webpage.
- Candidates do not have to complete whole assignment in a single session, and activities can generally be done in any order
- If unsuccessful, another assignment on different topic needs to be completed.




