Summer 2025 series: Core exams and Employer-Set Project entry window open

Entry windows are now open for core assessments for Summer 2025. Please ensure students are entered for the required exams and Employer-Set Project ahead of these dates.

Please be reminded that students may use either the upcoming Summer 2025 series, or the following Autumn 2025 series as their first attempt at Core assessments. Students must sit both exam papers within the same series, however they may complete the Employer-Set Project within a different series if they choose to.

Please ensure that you review and use the dates listed below as there have been amendments to previously published dates.

Emergency situations affecting assessment delivery

Our 'Emergency Situations Affecting Assessment Delivery' (version 3.2) covers important information on emergency situations affecting assessment delivery.



Centre staff and all those involved in the administration of examinations must be familiar with this guidance, and steps that you should take in the event that a timetabled examination cannot go ahead, especially due to severe weather or public health incidents.

City & Guilds provide contingency exam dates in the event of national disruption as listed in our published timetables. These contingency days must only be used if a significant, unexpected event arises nationally during the exam period such that no students (or a large number of them) are unable to take an exam when planned.

This is part of City & Guilds' contingency planning for timetabled examinations. These dates cannot be used for individual candidate absence, illness or local events at individual centres.

Please note that centres must not take it upon themselves to utilise a contingency exam date without written permission from City & Guilds, or where a centre-wide announcement is made due to national disruption.

Approval window for T Level Technical Qualification delivery from September 2025

Each year, City & Guilds opens an approval window where Department for Education Approved Providers can apply to deliver T Levels with City & Guilds.

The approval window will open on Monday, 24 February 2025 and will continue until Friday, 27 June 2025.



The T Level Technical Qualifications which are available for approval are set out in the table below.

Please note that Building Services Engineering is no longer available for applications through City & Guilds.

Updated guidance on T Levels industry placements

The Department for Education has released new guidance on the delivery of T Levels industry placements. The guidance can be accessed here, and the main changes include:

- Allowing up to 20% of the placement to take place remotely (up to 50% for T Levels in the Digital route)
- Allowing the placement to take place at route level as well as pathway level
- Allowing small team projects and simulated activities in skills hub and training centres to take place on the provider site (as well as
 externally), where this activity is delivered and overseen by the industry placement employer.

These new approaches are now applicable to all T Level students, with the exception of Education and Early Years and Dental Nursing specialisms, where there are specific requirements linked to licence to practice. Alongside the updated delivery guidance, there are also a range of other existing approaches that can be used to deliver placements – this is made clear in the guidance.

City & Guilds communications survey
