Our level 2 and level 3 apprenticeship standards and end-point assessment (EPA) are available in England for learners over 16 with no upper age limit.

Apprenticeship standards are funded by the government or via an employer levy, which can be used to pay for training and assessment costs.

Every apprenticeship ends with an EPA. As a market leader, we have delivered more than 80,000 assessments since EPA started, with a 90% pass rate.

Apprentices learn directly from experienced industry professionals, receiving training both on the job and off the job, all while contributing to their organisation and earning a salary.

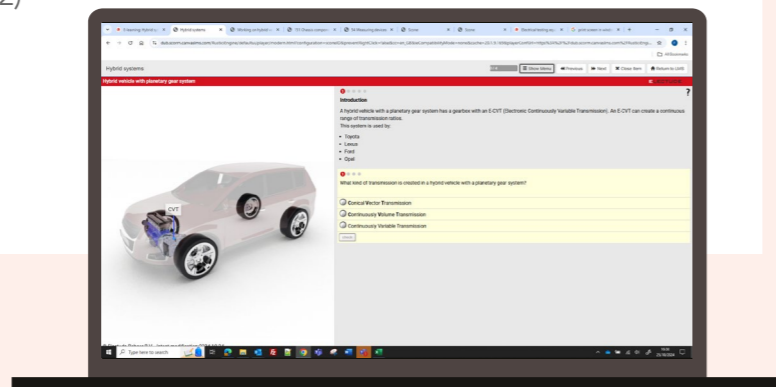

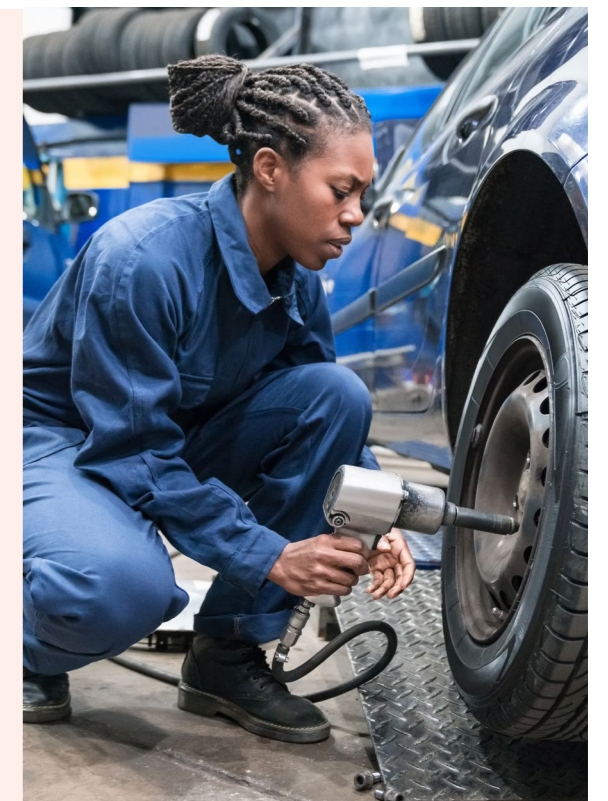
### NEW

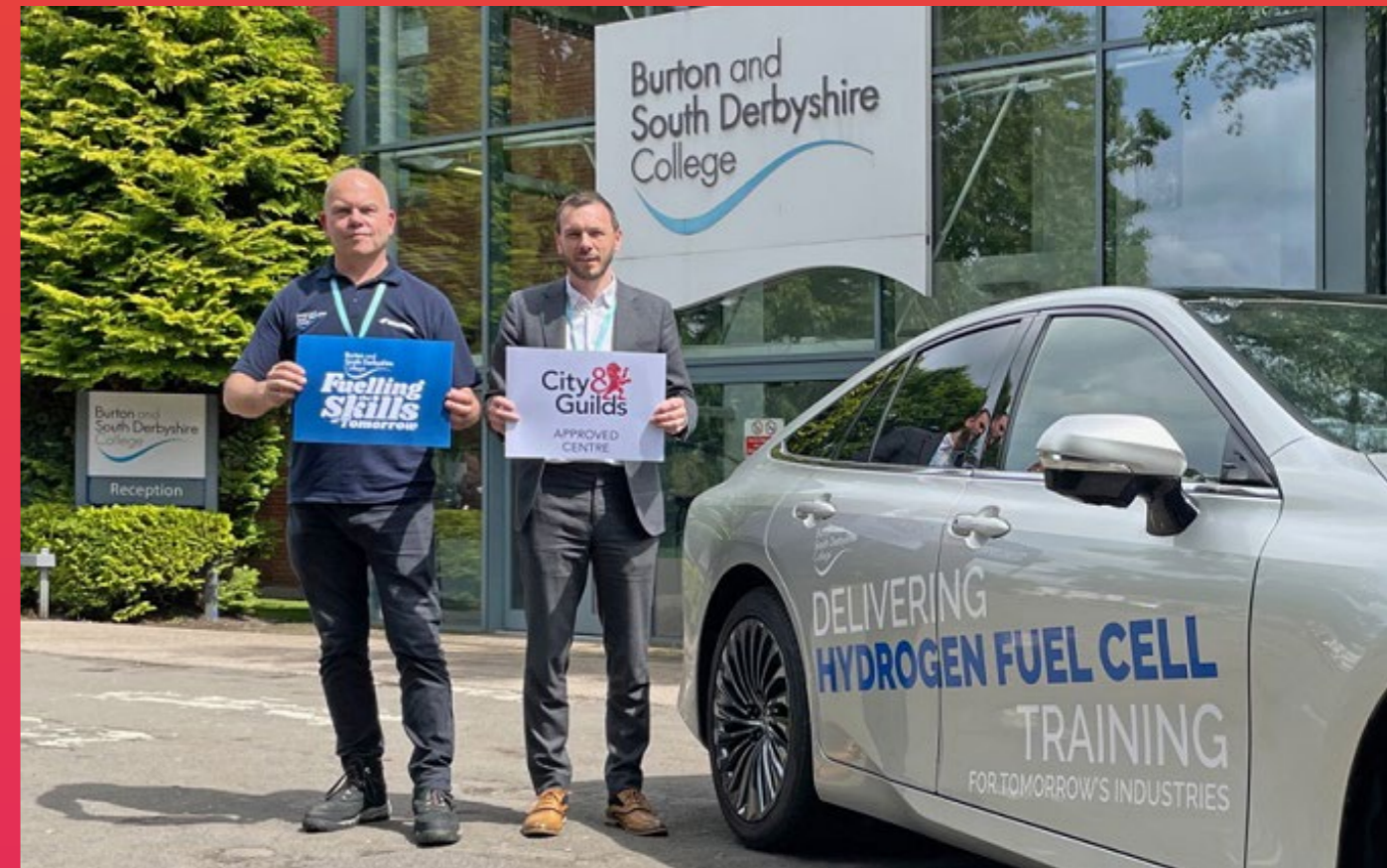


## Electric vehicle maintenance, hydrogen, mobile air conditioning and advanced driver assist systems (ADAS) qualifications – short courses

## Damage assessor, paint, panel MET qualifications

These qualifications are for learners who wish to gain skills in the vehicle damage paint, damage panel or mechanical & electrical trim (MET) sector. The roles requiring these skills are typically linked to maintaining and repairing the paint and bodywork of damaged vehicles.

**Please note:** 7271-43 is an assessment product, used to assess people working as vehicle damage assessors who would like to demonstrate their competence in their own workplace. Candidates must have at least three years' experience in the role prior to assessment. These assessments are linked to BS10125 and cover the required knowledge, skills, and techniques for the job role.

## MOT qualifications

These qualifications, approved by the Driver Vehicle and Standards Agency (DVSA), are for learners who are already experienced in the automotive repair sector (with at least four years' full-time employment, permitted by law), in the service and repair of the vehicle types to be tested, who want to become an MOT tester or an MOT manager (authorised examiner/designated manager).

To become an MOT tester, or an authorised examiner/designated manager, a learner will need to achieve these qualifications as a first step towards becoming licensed in England, Wales and Scotland.

In addition, the DVSA require all testers and managers to complete MOT annual training and a multiple-choice online test assessment.

## Bus driving qualification

This qualification will provide the knowledge and expertise required to enable bus drivers to deliver a consistent level of service to customers using buses within London. Any new Transport for London (TfL) bus driver will need to take this qualification as a mandatory requirement.

This qualification has been developed for bus drivers working for bus operators in London aged 18 or over who hold the minimum of a provisional PCV licence.

## T Levels

T Levels are fully-funded qualifications available in England only for 16–19-year-olds. Based on the same set of standards as apprenticeships, these two-year programmes combine classroom or workshop-based learning with a 45-day work placement to give young learners a breadth of knowledge and skills relating to the automotive sector.

The Engineering and Manufacturing T Level includes a Maintenance, Installation and Repair pathway, with a Light & Electrical Vehicles Occupational Specialism (OS).

The purpose of this OS is for learners to know fundamental light and electric vehicle systems and undertake key procedures for maintenance and repair. Learners interested in this route will complete:

- 8730 Engineering and Manufacturing Core (Mandatory). This is common across all Engineering and Manufacturing T Level pathways
- 8712–35 Light & Electric Vehicles (Occupational Specialism)
- 45-day industry placement

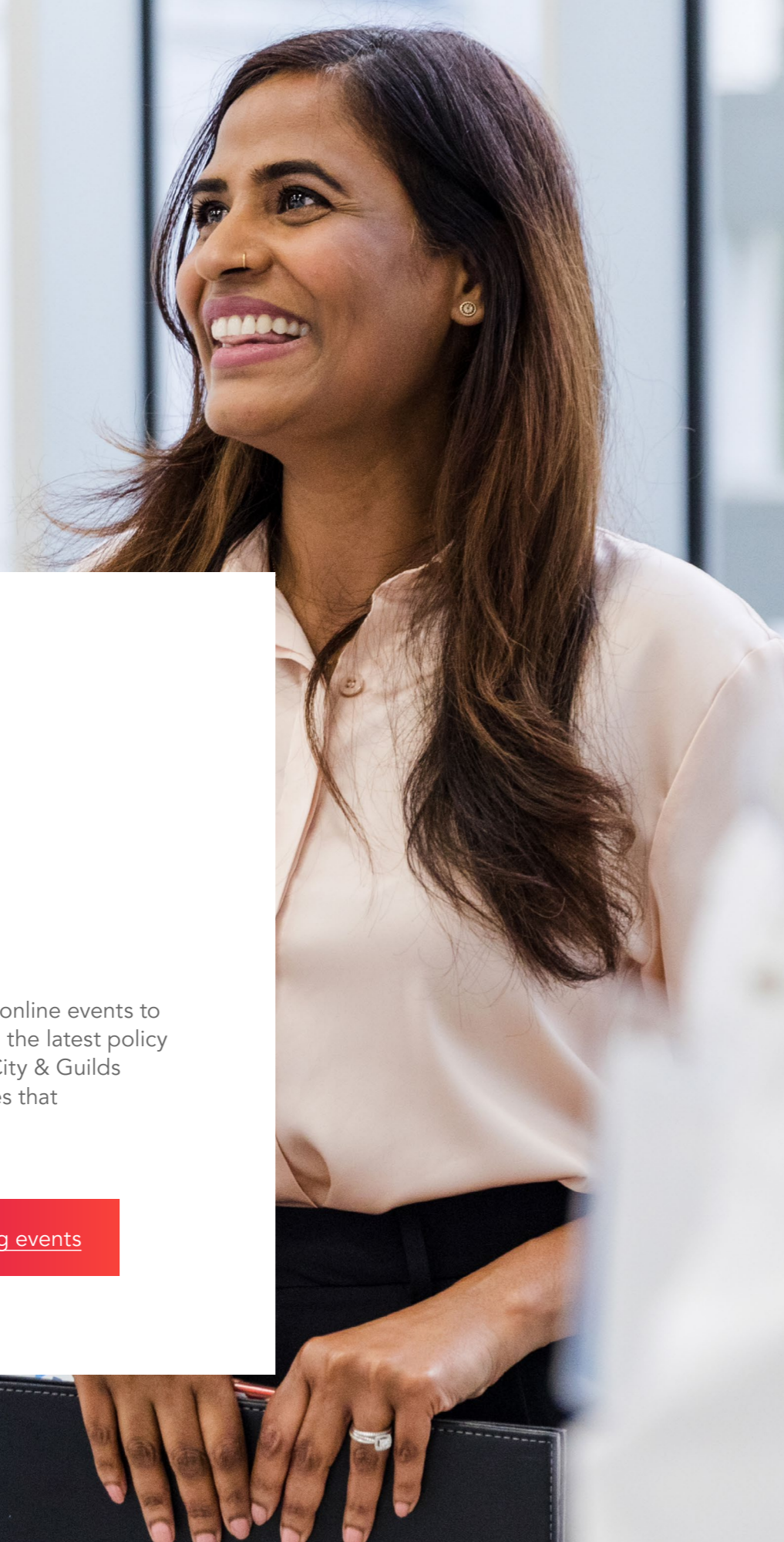

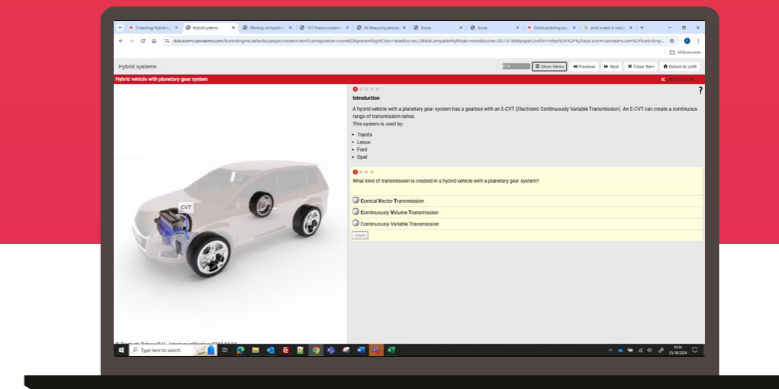
