OVERVIEW

- What does this qualification cover?

This qualification covers a wide range of areas related to the skills and knowledge required for working in the Equine industry.

All learners must take the mandatory units:

Clean and maintain stables

Provide feed and water to horses

Carry out routine care and monitor the health and well-being of horses

Restrain horses using specified methods

Monitoring and maintaining health and safety

Maintain and develop personal performance

Establish and maintain effective working relationships with others

There are a wide number of optional units that can be taken to meet your special interests or industry/local need. You can take one of the following pathways:

Horse Care

Horse Care & Riding

Breeding

This is a Framework qualification.

- Who could take this qualification? OR who is this qualification designed for?

This qualification is part of the Apprenticeship in Horse Care, or it may be taken as a stand alone qualification.

It is a work-related, competence-based qualification, and is designed for someone in work or who wishes to progress into work. It reflects the skills and knowledge needed to do a job effectively, and shows that you are competent in the area of work the qualification represents.

The qualification may allow you to combine working on a Yard, Riding School, Trekking Centre, or Stud or a similar job, and typically involves you attending one day a week at College or with a Training Provider.

There are no specific prior achievements required to take this qualification, but a Level 1 or another Level 2 qualification in Horse Care or related Land-based subjects could be an advantage

You need to be 16 years old or over to take this qualification.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to jobs such as:

- Assistant Groom
- Assistant Stud Worker/Hand
- Trek Assistant

You could progress to an Apprenticeship at Level 3 or other qualifications at Level 3 such as:

Level 3 Certificate in Horse Management
Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Horse Management
Level 3 90 Credit Diploma in Horse Management
Level 3 Diploma in Horse Management
Level 3 Extended Diploma in Horse Management

Level 3 Diploma in Work-based Horse Care & Management (stand alone or as part of an Apprenticeship).
