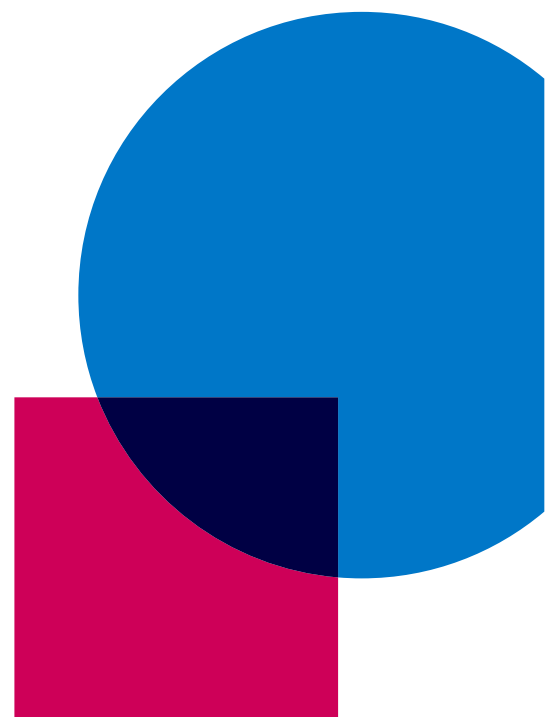

<p>ESOL Skills for Life is for anyone based in the UK for whom English is a second or additional language.</p> <p>These qualifications focus on the language used in everyday situations, helping learners into work or function more effectively in an English-speaking environment.</p>	<p>Available at five levels: Entry 1, Entry 2, Entry 3, Level 1 and Level 2. Based on the National Standards for Adult Literacy, and aligned to the Adult ESOL Core Curriculum.</p> <p>Each linguistic mode (Reading, Writing, Speaking & Listening) is a qualification in its own right, although they can also be combined into a 'full mode' qualification.</p>	<p>Learners can progress through the suite of qualifications, as well as progressing to other qualifications in English (e.g. Functional Skills or GCSE), or other City & Guilds qualifications (e.g. vocational or to support employability).</p> <p>Acquiring the English language skills to communicate effectively may also help learners to seek employment.</p>

Key Features:

Structure: Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening are each available as single-unit, Award-sized qualifications.

Full Mode, Certificate-sized qualifications (comprising all three, are also available).

Assessment: Entry Levels, plus Writing at Levels 1&2 and Speaking and Listening at Levels 1&2: set assignments - centre assessed with external quality assurance.

Reading Levels 1&2: external test - available on demand, onscreen or on paper

Support: Range of sample assessments available across all levels.
