Jack-o-lantern

Follow our four easy steps to carve your own beautiful pumpkin lantern.

1. Choose a large pumpkin and cut off the crown.



2. Next, use a large spoon to take out the insides.



3. Use a black pen to draw a simple face on the pumpkin. Cut out the eyes, nose and mouth.
Remember: Always cut away from you so you don't hurt yourself.



4. Put a tea light (small candle) inside the pumpkin, light it and put the crown back on. You now have a perfect 'Jack-o-lantern' for your garden.
